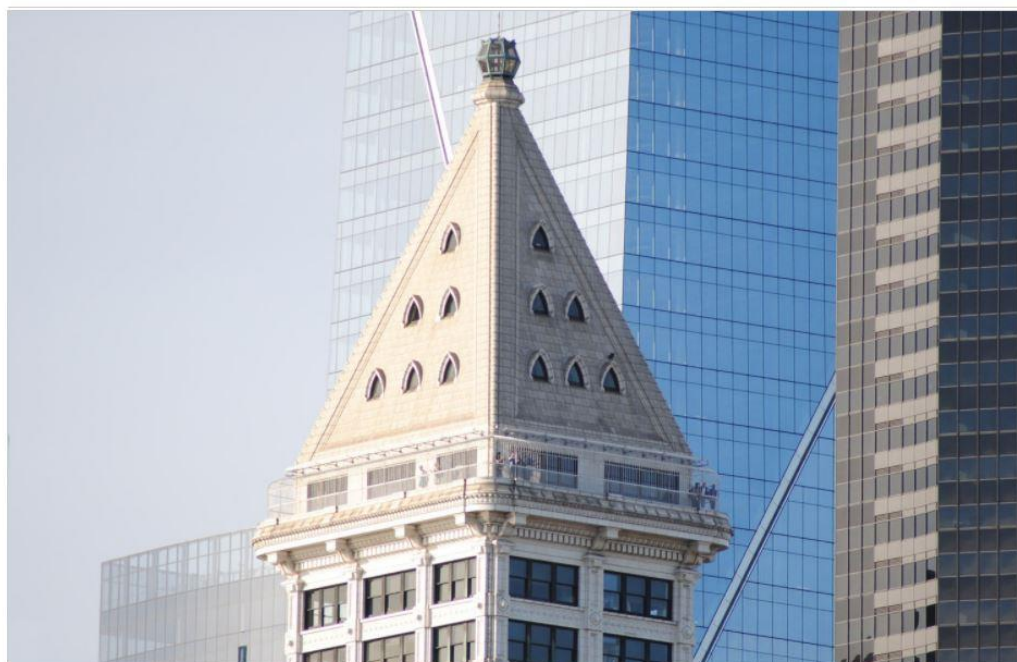


## A Sunny Seattle Day
